COMPOSTING(Eartheasy.com)

Composting is an easy way to add nutrient rich ingredients into depleted soil. It's also free, easy to make and good for the environment. Composting adds microscopic organisms that help aerate the soil, break down organic material for plant use and ward off plant disease. It's a wonderful soil conditioner. With composting, you are creating a rich humus for lawn and garden use. This add nutrients to your plants and helps retain moisture in the soil. Composting can divert as much as 30% of household waste away from your garbage can! Most landfills in North America are quickly filling up; many have already closed. One third of landfill waste is made up of compostable materials.

What to Compost?-Fruit and vegetable scraps, eggshells, leaves, grass clippings, garden plants (disease free), shrub prunings, straw or hay, pine needles, flowers, cuttings, wood ash, chicken manure, coffee grounds, tea leaves, newspaper(avoid glossy and colored inks), cardboard(avoid glossy and colored inks), corn cobs, dryer lint, sawdust(be sure to spread thinly), wood chips, shredded paper(avoid glossy and colored inks). You can also add garden soil to your compost to help add micro-organisms that help speed up the process.

What NOT to Compost?- Do NOT compost meat, bones or fish scraps. No perennial weeds or diseased plants. Do not use pet manure in compost that will be used on food crops.
