ITALIAN ORZO TOMATO SPINACH SOUP

From Little Spice Jar

Ingredients:

2 T. Olive Oil

1 ½ C. chopped onions

1 ¼ C carrots, sliced into ½ inch rounds

1 C. celery, chopped

6 cloves garlic

6 ½ C. chicken stock

2 (14.5 oz.) cans fire roasted diced tomatoes

1 ½ T. pesto

1 ½ C. orzo

½ t. each: dried thyme, Italian seasoning, oregano

3 C. fresh baby spinach

Salt and Pepper to taste

Fresh grated parmesan cheese

-Heat oil in a dutch oven over medium-high heat. Add onions and saute for 4-5 minutes until soft. Add carrots, celery and garlic. Continue to saute for an additional 3 minutes. Add stock, along with the tomatoes, pesto, orzo, thyme, Italian seasoning, and oregano, stir to combine. Reduce the heat to medium and let the orzo cook to al-dente, about 10 minutes. Stir occasionally.

Just before serving, add the baby spinach and continue to cook for 1 minute or until spinach gets bright green and wilts down. Season with salt and pepper. Serve warm with grated parmesan cheese on top.
