Town of Forestburgh Spring Clean-Up

The Town of Forestburgh Spring Clean-up will be from **May 6th – May 11th**. Residents must separate materials into the following categories prior to bringing them to the Town Highway Department:

- -Appliance and scrap metal
- -Construction and demolition debris, and bulky waste
- -Recyclables
- ***ANY BULK WASTE SHOULD BE NEAT AND TIED WITH A ROPE***

The following items will not be accepted:

NO: tires, refrigerators, air conditioners, fuel tanks, oil drums, large propane tanks, full or partially full cans of paint, petroleum products, pesticides, any other hazardous waste.

NO: brush, yard waste, bags of leaves, stumps, rocks, items greater than 4 feet in length (must cut to proper size), household garbage, commercial waste, asbestos, or liquids.

NO: electronic scrap, explosives, ammunitions, radioactive materials, medical waste, medications, and batteries.
