Dr. Takamine Jokichi (1854-1922) was a prominent Japanese scientist who lived and worked in New York for much of his professional life at a time when very few Japanese people even so much as traveled outside of Japan. He was known for a number or major contributions to medical scientific knowledge, including the development of the digestive enzyme Takadiastase in 1894 and the isolation of adrenaline in crystalline form in 1900. Dr. Takamine also produced several artificial fertilizers and developed what is now known as the Takamine method of wheat bran fermentation, which is used in the process of whiskey production. He married an American woman, Caroline, and they lived in New York with their children. Dr. Takamine and his wife worked tirelessly for the cause of friendship between the United States and Japan. He was one of the founders of the Nippon Club and the Japan Society, the two leading New York area organizations promoting cultural understanding. In 1911 through the mayor of Tokyo, Dr. Takamine gave 3,000 cherry trees along the Potomac River in Washington, D.C., a gift which gave rise to the now-traditional springtime cherry blossom festival in Washington. He also acquired 2,100 cherry trees for planting in Riverside Park in New York City, and the area surrounding Grant's Tomb which was renamed Sakuza Park. The area to also receive trees became known as "Cherry Walk" in Central Park. Dr. Takamine, being a chemist, sent 50 cherry trees to the Park Davis Drug Company.
