# **Dog Control Officer**

Reminder to all dog owners: by law all dogs must have current RABIES vaccinations and be licensed. Rabies and license tags must be attached to the dog's collar or harness at all times. Sullivan County offers free rabies clinics throughout the year in various locations, or your veterinarian will administer the vaccine. There has been a significant increase in abandoned dogs, dogs roaming loose and bite incidents. Letting dogs run loose is not only illegal it also creates a safety hazard for the public, the dog and other pets. Please be a responsible dog owner and a good neighbor.

Albany, NY - Sullivan County's Gayle Irving and Sabina Toomey travelled last month to Albany to each receive the NYS Office for the Aging's "Older New Yorker" award.

"Gayle and Sabina exemplify the kind of 55+ volunteers we have in our County," said Sullivan County Office for the Aging Director Lise-Anne Deoul, who accompanied the duo to the ceremony. "They give without thought of getting anything in return, but I'm so happy that the State was able to recognize them in this wonderful way!"

Irving volunteers with the Alzheimer's Association and currently serves as a community representative, community educator, and on the Orange/Sullivan Walk to End Alzheimer's committee. "Don't let opportunities to help others pass by," the Grahamsville resident says. "By giving your time and skills, volunteering strengthens community bonds and supports those in need. It also creates positive change by learning new perspectives and building a more resilient, compassionate New York. You will find the reward is priceless." ### **Our Town** (As submitted by Town Historian Sabina Toomey)

Dr. Thomas Darlington, New York City Health Commissioner, was in the area to locate his dream of providing city residents a healthy place which would get them out of the city heat and bad air. He purchased what is now the Monmouth Council Boy Scout Camp on Route 42. "Camp Forestburgh" became the name of his venture. Weekly rates were \$21.50 for double occupancy and \$24.00 for a single room. On Monday, June 13, 1932 at 4:45 pm Dr. Darlington gave a long talk about vacation and the benefits of the fresh air. He talked about a stay at Camp Forestburgh, a Christian camp on Burnt-Hope Lake. Hammocks could be rented for 50 cents a week. Campers could arrange a trip to shop in Port Jervis for 25 cents. More about this special place in time will be found on Our Town History link on the town website. When out of doors, make sure to be well hydrated and use sun protection. Enjoy the serenity.
